Evening/Weekend Student Advisor Training:

The Advisor role is unique to the Fashion Design Department at FIT because of the demand of our Program. You are in the unique position of gatekeeper to our students.





Who We Are

The Evening/Weekend Student is unique. They usually work during the week and therefore can only take classes evenings/ weekends. By offering them classes that they need in a timely manner you can help them stay on track to graduation. You will do this while also keeping any specializations in mind (Sportswear, Special Occasion/Haute Couture, Tailoring, etc.).

Module Training Goals

The Goals of this first module of training is to identify the various evening/weekend programs under your jurisdiction and their sequencing/prerequisites to entry. The most popular Evening/Weekend programs are the AAS Degree in Fashion Design, The Haute Couture Certificate and the CAD for Fashion Design Certificates.

Students need to be matriculated to be a part of the AAS degree program, but not the certificate programs. Non-matriculated students can take up to 20 credits directly through the registrar. Oftentimes, degree-seeking students will also want to take classes towards a certificate. Please familiarize yourself with each program's sequencing:




